



Academic Thoracic Surgeon

The Department of Surgery (www.surgery.queensu.ca) at Queen's University invites applications for a full-time Academic Thoracic Surgeon who has formal training and a primary interest in both Thoracic and Foregut Surgery. Candidates must have advanced minimally invasive skills and must have demonstrated strong clinical skills. Emerging or established research programs will be considered an asset. Preference will be given to applicants who can provide evidence of a current involvement and commitment to education through the submission of an educational dossier and the identification of referees who can attest to the applicant's educational expertise.

Qualified applicants will hold an MD degree (or equivalent), have completed postgraduate qualifications prior to appointment, and be eligible for licensure in Ontario. Preference will be given to candidates with an advanced degree and who have sub-specialty certification from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. The successful applicant will hold a Geographically Full-Time appointment at Queen's University and will be a participant in the Alternative Funding Plan at Queen's.

The successful candidate will be required to work closely with Thoracic and General Surgeons at the Kingston General and Hotel Dieu Hospitals. As a full time member of the Department of Surgery, they will also be expected to contribute to the teaching, supervision and mentorship of undergraduate, graduate and postgraduate students.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, in accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada will be given priority. To comply with Federal Laws, the University is obliged to gather statistical information about how many applicants from each job vacancy are Canadian citizens/permanent residents of Canada, Applicants need not identify their country of origin or citizenship, however, all applicants must include one of the following statements: "I am a Canadian citizen/permanent resident of Canada" OR, "I am not a Canadian citizen/permanent resident of Canada". Applications that do not include this information will be deemed incomplete.

The review of applications is on-going and will continue until the position is filled. Applications are to include a letter summarizing expertise, qualifications, and accomplishments relevant to the position, a CV, and the names and full contact information of three referees.
