The Division of Orthopedic Surgery at Queen's University offers a comprehensive one-year hand and upper extremity fellowship. The fellowship is open to appropriately qualified Canadian and internationally trained orthopedic surgeons who are seeking additional subspecialty training in hand and upper extremity.

Clinical supervision is by two orthopedic surgeons, with a subspecialty practice in hand and upper extremity surgery. The focus of this fellowship is in hand, wrist and elbow. The program offers a broad, tertiary care experience in all aspects of upper extremity surgery, including reconstruction, arthroplasty, arthroscopy, trauma, and peripheral nerve.

In addition, extensive research opportunities are provided in a multidisciplinary research team focusing on clinical outcomes, basic science and orthopedic bio-engineering. Fellows are expected to participate in research activities. Protected weekly research time will be allocated to a project of publishable quality expected at the completion of the fellowship. Fellows will be expected to participate in a variety of related academic activities, including formal and informal medical student and resident teaching and preparation of rounds and conferences.
