The Division of Orthopedic Surgery at Queen's University offers a comprehensive one-year shoulder and elbow fellowship, designed to focus on all aspects of shoulder and elbow pathology. The fellowship is open to appropriately qualified Canadian and internationally trained orthopedic surgeons who are seeking additional subspecialty training in upper extremity.

Clinical supervision is by one orthopedic surgeon with a subspecialty practice in shoulder and elbow surgery. The program offers a broad, tertiary care experience in all aspects of shoulder and elbow surgery, including reconstruction, arthroplasty, arthroscopy, trauma, and sports injuries.

In addition, extensive research opportunities are provided in a multidisciplinary research laboratory focusing on clinical outcomes, orthopedic bio-engineering, computer-assisted surgery and molecular biology. Protected weekly research time will be allocated to a project of publishable quality expected at the completion of the fellowship.

Fellows will be expected to participate in a variety of related academic activities, including formal and informal medical student and resident teaching and preparation of rounds and conferences.
