#### **EPA 6: Participating in surgical procedures**

## **DETAILED DESCRIPTION**

The focus of this EPA is the ability of the resident to function effectively and professionally as an operating room team member in a junior surgical role. The resident must possess and apply relevant anatomical knowledge, be able to perform basic procedural tasks and effectively assist the primary surgeon when performing more complex procedural tasks. Residents must display insight, recognizing when assistance of more experienced surgeons is required and seek that assistance immediately. The resident must display competence at basic surgical skills, such as tissue handling, incisions and dissection, suturing skills, simple hemorrhage control and insertion / removal of drains.

# ENTRUSTMENT

The resident will be entrusted to:

- 1. Recognize situations that require more experienced colleagues and seek that assistance immediately.
- 2. Perform basic procedural tasks and techniques in a timely, skillful, safe manner.
- 3. Assist and take direction from the primary surgeon.
