EPA 8: Managing post-operative patients with complications

DETAILED DESCRIPTION

This EPA is focused on the resident's ability to manage common complications that occur in post-operative patients. Common post-operative complication would include, but is not limited to, fevers, low urine output, hypotension, bleeding, pain, dyspnea, ileus, delirium. The resident must be able to perform a focused clinical assessment, formulate a differential diagnosis, and recognize urgent problems and those that require assistance from more experienced colleagues. The development and implementation of an appropriate management plan must be displayed, focused on patient safety and welfare, while adhering to institutional policies and clinical practice guidelines.

ENTRUSTMENT

The resident will be entrusted to:

- 1. Perform a focused clinical examination and generate a differential diagnosis.
- 2. Formulate and implement a post-operative care plan for patients with post-operative complications.
- 3. Enlist the assistance of more experienced colleagues in cases where appropriate.

- At least 3 assessors
- At least 4 different complications
- 1. Competency in performing a clinical examination and generating a differential diagnosis will be assessed by: direct observation and chart review
- 2. Competency in documentation will be assessed by: chart review
- 3. Competency in implementing a post-operative care plan will be assessed by: chart review
